It was fine until there was about five minutes left to go. Everybody piled out while the film was still running. We thank Doug Freburg for getting us out of class.....

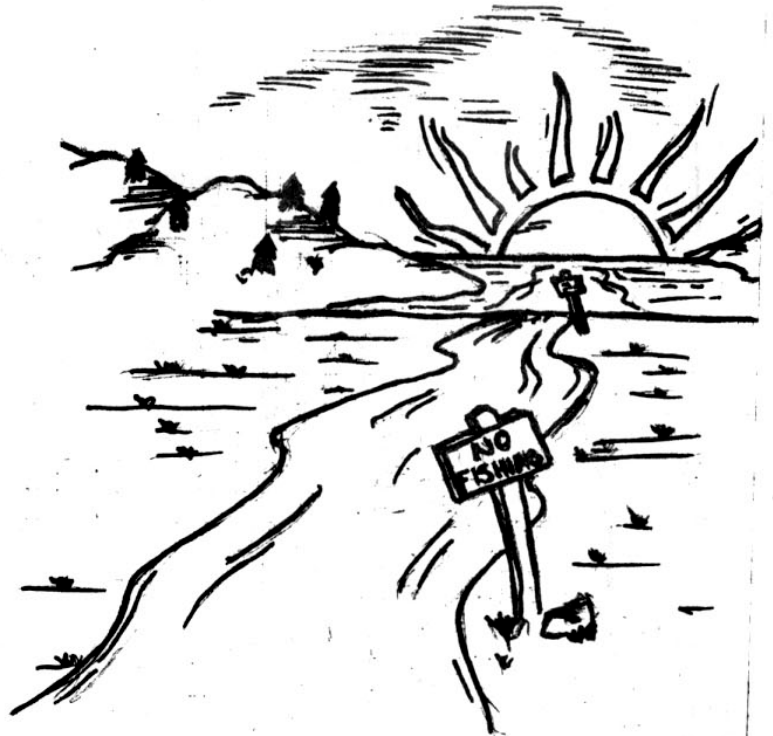

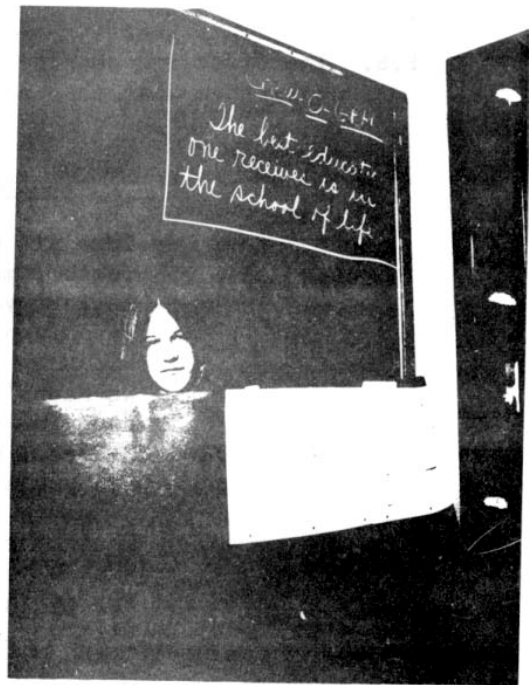
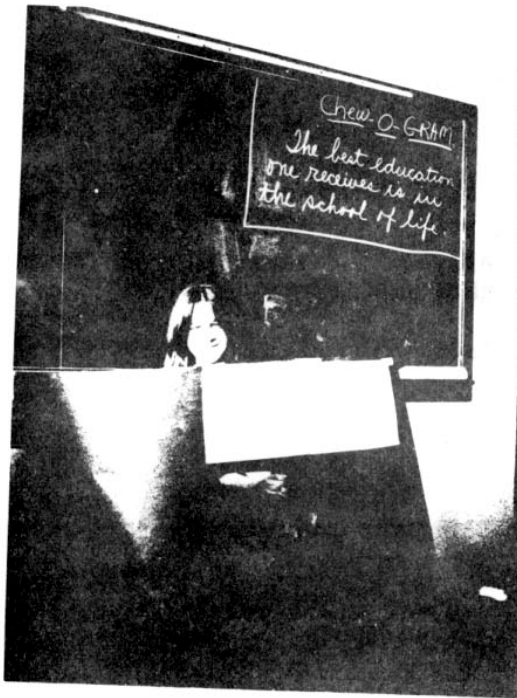
