During the 11-week training cycle, he learned the basics of battlefield survival. He was introduced to the typical daily routine that he will experience during his enlistment and studied the personal and professional standards traditionally exhibited by Marines.

He participated in an active physical conditioning program and gained proficiency in a

variety of military skills, including first aid, rifle marksmanship and close order drill. Teamwork and self-discipline were emphasized throughout the training cycle. He joined the Marine Corps in September 1977.

## 4-19 Jim Fritzberg dies of leukemia

James W. Fritzberg, principal of College Place Junior High, died Friday night of acute leukemia at a Seattle Hospital.

He had been at College Place for two years and for 10 years prior to that was principal at Lynnwood Junior High, and lived in Edmonds.

Fritzberg, 46, had been active in scouting, having served for 10 years with troop 125, the last four as

committee chairman. He served as chairman of the District 15 Ski School Board for four years.

He was a member of the Free and Accepted Masons of Nooksack Valley and belonged to the Edmonds United Methodist Church.

After having taught for two years in Wenatchee and one year in Germany, Fritzberg began his 22 years in District 15 as a teacher at Lynnwood Junior High in 1958.

He was a counselor at Edmonds Junior High for two years and a vice principal at Madrona Junior High for three years.

A native of Everson and a Nooksack Valley high school graduate, Fritzberg received his Bachelors and Masters Degrees from Western Washington University.

Jim and his wife Marie celebrated their 25th wedding anniversary on March 21.

He is survived by his wife, two sons, Jon, 20, and Greg, 14, his parents Mr. and Mrs. William Fritzberg of Everson and two brothers, Donald, of Primrose, Oregon, and Dr. Alan Fritzberg of Denver. Memorials can be made to the Fred Hutchinson Cancer Center.
