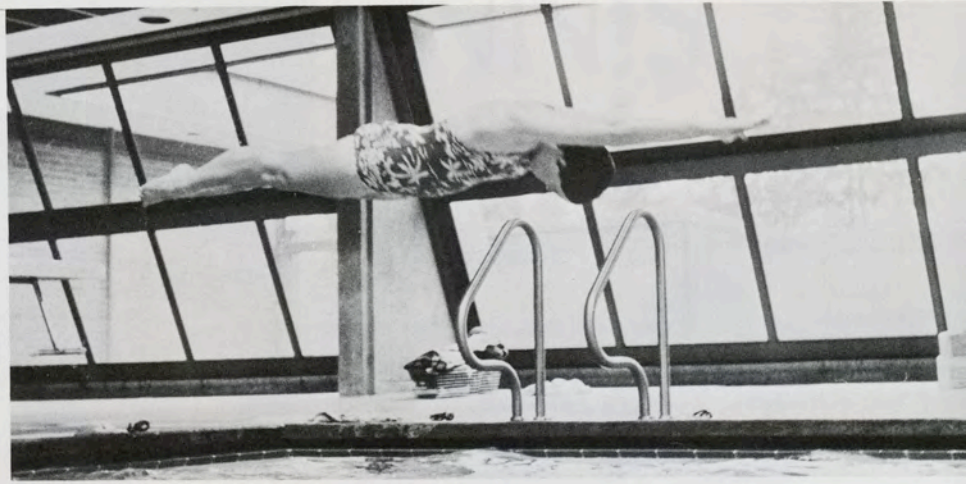
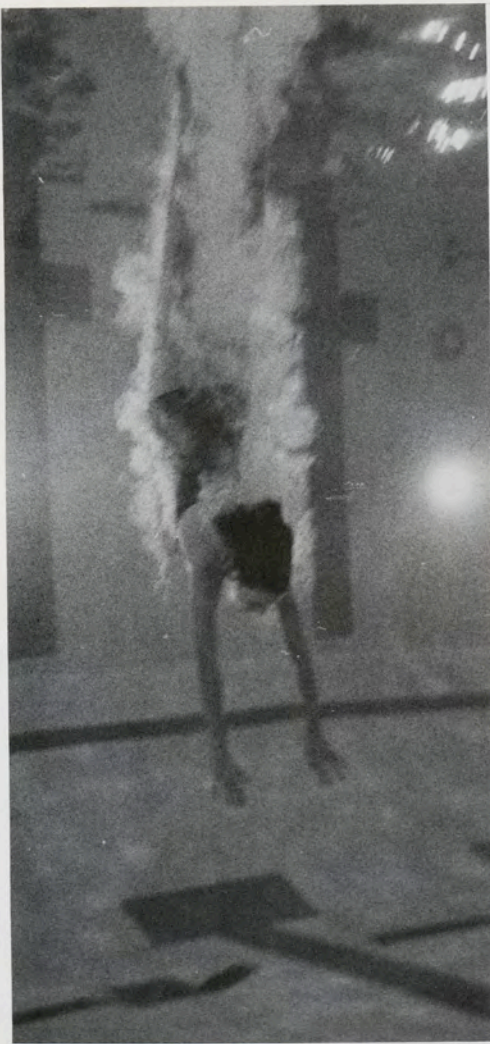
MEN'S TENNIS

WILL YOU BE MY FRIEND?

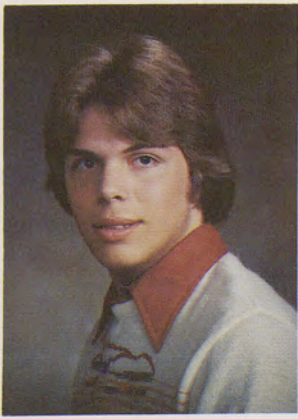
Beyond need.

FLASHBACK . . .

In this year, we the class of 1978 take time to reflect on the events and happenings of our graduating year. These events, from our "roots" here at Lynnwood, to the state, to the nation, to the world level, have shaped this year into what has become a year of positive growth intellectually, politically and socially, and what we hope will be the foundation for success in the years to come.

Here at Lynnwood, we have learned to grow together. During our junior year, the leadership of our state changed hands after 12 years of capable administration on the part of Daniel Evans. In his place came the first woman in the history of Washington to be elected governor, Dixie Lee Ray.

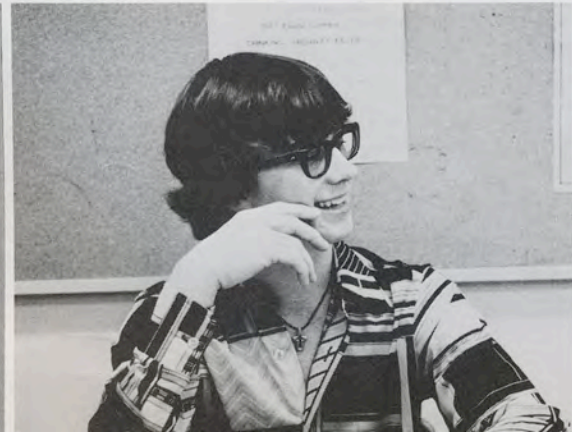
Governor Ray immediately made it known she was her own woman. She dug her heels in on the issue of energy and tankers in Puget Sound. She was certainly not singular in her concern about the future needs of energy. President Carter, responding to voters concern, put forth considerable effort to pass an energy bill in Congress. Passage of such a bill will not be easy as it calls for changing lifestyles but there is a growing awareness on the part of Americans that, as in the beginning of their country, strength lay in independence, and such independence can only be regained through total participation, commitment, and conservation. The issue of energy was not the only battle fought during 77-78. For the first time in U.S. history, women of all ages and from all walks of life sat down at a round table and discussed issues of concern ranging from childcare, the holding of political office and the passage of the ERA amendment.



Internationally, change was also in the making abroad. Anwar Sadat, President of Egypt, asked Menachen Begin to join him at the negotiation table in an effort to bring about peaceful co-existence in the Middle East. One can only hope that the final outcome will be successful.

The movie industry hit the jackpot this year as we all joined the cult of "Let The Force Be With You", and stood in lines to see "Star Wars" thus bringing to an end the reigning champ of two and a half years, "JAWS". "Husky Fever" broke loose as the Washington dogs led their football team to victory of the Michigan Wolverines, becoming the Rose Bowl champs. The Denver Broncos needed more orange crush in their diet as they fell to defeat at the hands of the Dallas Cowboys in the Super Bowl. O.J. Simpson of the Buffalo Bills with an NFL record of 250 yards, rushed 273 yards against Detroit. Payton of the Chicago Bears then did the impossible and rushed for 275 yards against the Minnesota Vikings. The powerful, three year old colt, Seattle Slew raced to victory and won the prized triple crown, thus becoming the tenth horse in world history to do so. Reggie Jackson hit three home runs in the sixth and final game of the World Series to lead the New York Yankees to victory over the LA Dodgers.

A battle of another kind was fought by the beloved Senator and former Vice-President from





Minnesota, Hubert Humphrey. He lost his fight with cancer on January 13th, 1978. Americans everywhere will miss him and are grateful to him for the dedication and leadership he gave to our country. The "Happy Warrior" will long be remembered for his contribution to our political system and government, but most of all for the optimistic and positive attitude in which he handled all endeavors.

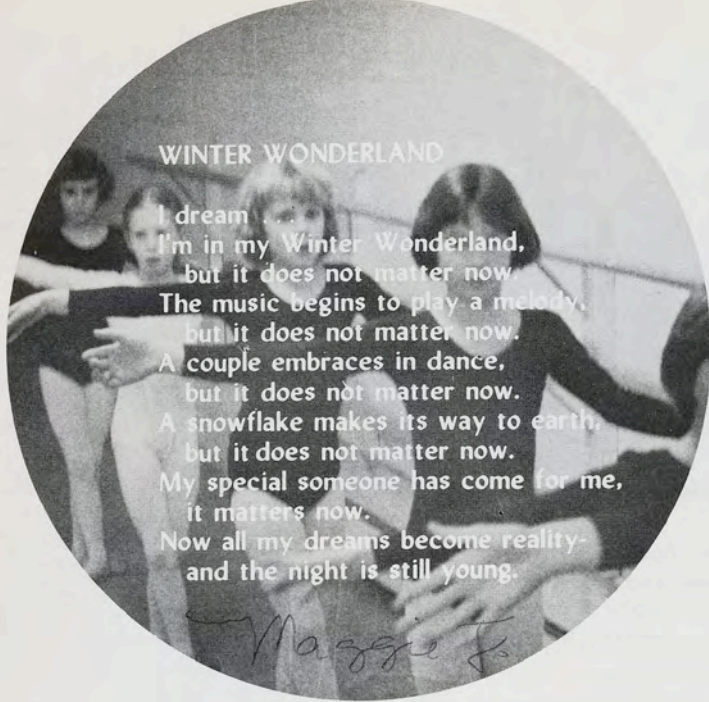
Musically we experienced the loss of the "King of Rock 'n Roll", Elvis Presley. In the world of silent movies, Charlie Chaplin passed on after lighting so many of our lives with his mime comedy.

The world lost many other talents this past year. Among them, Bing Crosby who died at 73, a star of 70 movies, 850 records and 40 million singles of "White Christmas". Leopold Stowkowski died in 1995, a premier conductor for 68 years and the maestro of Disney's "Fantasia". Comedian classis troucho Marx, famous for his stoggie cigar and leering eyes, died at 86 leaving behind him a legend of comical genius. Ludwig Erhard left us at 80, the architect of Bonn's economic miracle. This New Year's welcome was less one old friend, Guy Lombardo who died at 75, leaving behind 3 American New Years with "Auld Lang Syne". We lost Zero Mostel who outlived the blacklist and won Broadway as Tevye in "Fiddler on the Roof". Sir Anthony Eden, the luckless heir, Churchill's successor to the Prime Minister, died at 79. And Devine is also gone at 71, leaving behind 300 squeaky-voiced movies in which he appeared. Freddie Prince, a star at 19 with his Puerto Rican accented comedy, tragically committed suicide at 22. The ex-GI novelist James Jones whose roughhewn "From Here to Eternity" was a classic of World War II, died at 55. The great British film star, Peter Finch, passed on after anchoring M-G-M's "Network". Maria Callas called La Divine for her smoky soprano and her fiery operatic style, died at 53. Beautiful Queen Lilia of Jordan, 28, was killed in a military helicopter crash. Ethel Waters, 80, passed on, leaving behind the story of her journey to Broadway and Hollywood. Erroll Garner was another loss, the jazz pianist and composer who could'n't read music but could write. 77-78 also noted the passing of Eddie (Rochester) Anderson, the sandpapery voice vaudevillian who played Jack Benny's valet, Robert Lowell, American poet, Vladimir Nabokov, writer, Joan Crawford, the Oscared leading lady of 80-plus movies, and Wernher von Braun, the wartime German rocket scientist who helped to put Americans on the moon. So many losses . . . and yet such change, entertainment, beauty and knowledge they shared with their fellow man and because of that sharing, added to our richness.

Although the loss of such great talent was deep this year, the world still possesses many others. And many young talents are springing up such as Debbie Boone, daughter Pat Boone with her gold record, "You Light Up My Life". Fleetwood Mac and their album "Rumors," has broken the world record in sales this year. Great music, great talent and great comedy are alive and flourishing.

These events and happenings from the world, to the nation, to the state to here at Lynnwood reflect the challenge and hope we should hold as we face the future. The beginning has just begun with our graduation. We face the future with confidence — confidence in ourselves, and in the world we are entering. No longer is the question, "Who am I?", but rather I am.
